Concealed Carry Permit Holders Across the United States: 2020

Abstract

During President Trump's administration, the number of concealed handgun permits has soared to over 19.48 million – a 34% increase over 2016. However, while gun sales have set records in 2020, the growth in concealed handgun permits has slowed as many states shutdown their issuance of new permits.

Unlike gun ownership surveys that may be affected by people's unwillingness to answer personal ques-

tions, concealed handgun permit data is the only really "hard data" that we have. Seventeen states no longer provide data on all the people who are legally carrying a concealed handgun because people in those states no longer need a permit to carry.

Among the findings of our report: Permits for women and minorities continue to increase at a much faster rate than for either men or whites. Alabama has the highest concealed carry rate — 28.5% of adults holding a permit, with Indiana in second with 18.7%. Five states now have over

one million permit holders, and 7.6% of American adults have permits. Outside the restrictive states of California and New York, about 9.2% of the adult population has a permit. Permit holders continue to be extremely law-abiding.

They tell the story of the United States and its global impact and reach through historically significant arms, patent models, and more.

Some pieces from the collection are on display, but the vast majority are not. Among the numerous racks of guns are ones that have stories, but you have to know what you're looking for.

The setup for photography is in a tucked-away little corner, sharing the space with a remarkable collection of swords. There, I photographed a handful of interesting pieces. Finally, the highlight of my trip was a piece I wasn't expecting to find: the original patent model created by John Moses Browning for his single-shot rifle. I opened up one of the gun room's many storage drawers

and there it was, in the middle of a bunch of other patent models with a simple hangtag that read, "John M. Browning Patent Model."

Of course, there's never enough time in the day to explore it all, and I had to leave before I was satiated. I guess that just means I'll have to make a return trip – and I'll be sure to bring you along for that one, too!

Below the Radar: Potential Gun Legislation you Need to Know About

HR 719 - The MICRO Act

(AmmoLand.com)- Any Second Amendment supporter has probably been aware of the famous 1976 quote by Nelson "Pete" Shields. They have probably used it at some point when trying to convince fellow Americans to oppose the unjust restrictions that anti-Second Amendment extremists seek to impose.

In fact, Shields, with that quote, has probably done a great deal to help Second Amendment supporters make their case against his agenda, so much so that anti-Second Amendment extremists are forced to find new ways to solve what Shields called "the second problem." That was, of course, getting all handguns registered.

These days, while some anti-Second Amendment extremists like Sheila Jackson Lee and Bobby Rush openly call for registration (usually in conjunction with licensing), many know that the only thing a push for registration will do is to ignite a groundswell of Second Amendment supporters who will do everything possible to vote them out of office. As a result, they have been trying to find new ways to get registration – and even bans – enacted through the back door.

One of those efforts is via "micro-stamping," and HR 719, the MICRO Act, introduced by Representative Anthony Brown (D-MD), is intended to impose this back-door registration/gun ban scheme at the federal level. It's a really crafty



scheme, when you think about it, and it makes Brown a far more dangerous adversary than Jackson Lee or Rush.

Microstamping is intended to place some distinctive marks on the casings ejected from a semiautomatic pistol. According to the text of HR 719, the make, model, and serial number of the gun is to be recorded on the casing. It would also become a federal crime to alter the microstamping. Two years after the bill was passed, no newly built or imported semiautomatic pistol could be sold without this technology.

Even if manufacturers figure out the technological hurdles, for microstamping to work, law enforcement have to know who the owner of the gun that left the casing is. That comes down to some sort of registration system – even if they do not call it that. Which very nicely solves the problem for when they decide to pass a Swalwell-esque bill at some later date.

Also, the penalties for this are civil and administrative as well. This is intended to put a manufacturer or FFL out of business. Especially if the technology isn't able to be implemented (which gives you a de facto ban on new semi-auto pistols). There is also no guarantee that this technology will even reduce crime. But it will greatly reduce options for those who wish to exercise their Second Amendment rights, especially for personal protection.

The MICRO Act is a scam on the American people. Second Amendment supporters should contact their Senators and Representative and urge them to oppose HR 719.

HR 3435 - the Local Public Health And Safety Protection Act

Much attention gets focused on federal and state legislation. This is very understandable, as that legislation can come with some serious penalties. But local laws also matter, especially when people need to be

in a certain locality for professional reasons. Often, these have been dealt with by preemption laws, something the NRA worked hard to get passed over the years.

But now, some want to change that. One of those is Representative William Lacy Clay (D-MO), who introduced HR 3435, the Local Public Health And Safety Protection Act. Now, this bill doesn't directly prohibit preemption laws. That would be a big stretch.

Clay instead takes an approach similar to that applied by Rep. Jamie Raskin and Sen. Chris Van Hollen with the Handgun Purchaser Licensing Act: He bribes states to dispense with preemption laws via federal grants. In addition, he bribes localities to enact restrictions on Second Amendment rights. In essence, these payoffs are meant to make the lives of law-abiding gun owners harder. How much harder?

If you remember the bad old days before there were preemption laws, you'd recall that there would be a patchwork of rules and land mines for a person exercising their Second Amendment rights. In some states, a concealed carry permit would be invalid in some cities, often those with high crime rates (where the need for concealed carry would be greatest – then again, gun control lacks a lot of logic).

In other words, you didn't just have to track state laws, you had to track the laws of every locality you might go to – or even pass through. The sheer scope of that task would discourage some to exercise their rights... which is the real intent behind those laws.

The goal of anti-Second Amendment extremists isn't to have the police or some other entity go door-to-door taking people's guns away. It's to get people to just give up their rights – or to cease advocating for their preservation – on their own accord through a combination of hassles and social stigmatization.

Clay's bill does the latter by putting Congress on record against state preemption laws, adding to the stigmatization of pro-Second Amendment efforts. That is why Second Amendment supporters need to contact their Senators and Representative and politely urge them to oppose HR 3435. We certainly don't need our states and cities bribed with our own tax dollars to infringe on our rights.

S 1924/HR 1705 - Jaime's Law

While we place a lot of the focus on defending against laws that target firearms, anti-Second Amendment extremists also target ammunition. In a way, this ammunition control can be worse – because those who exercise their Second Amendment rights need to purchase ammunition.

Now, those who exercise their Second Amendment rights will buy ammunition for any number of reasons: Actual use for personal protection or hunting, training and practice to ensure familiarity with the firearms that they might own, and even storing some for emergencies. These days, getting ammo is pretty easy, all things considered. In most states, you can either order online or pick it up at a local FFL.

Senator Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) wants to change that, proposing S 1924, Jaime's Law. A companion version, HR 1705, was introduced in the House by Representative Debbie Wasserman Schultz. This legislation would place background checks on any and all ammunition sales. It was also, like a number of anti-Second Amendment proposals, is also named for someone who was a victim of someone's misuse of firearms, in this case Jaime Guttenberg, who was killed in the Parkland shooting.

Those living in California know what messes that the background checks can cause for law-abiding citizens who simply want to exercise their constitutional rights. It has been a host of red tape that these people

have to deal with. Lucky ones can go across state lines to stock up, but it is often a big problem for people like Olympian Kim Rhode.

This legislation is particularly maddening for Second Amendment supporters. We know just how badly the bumbling cowards of Broward County botched the numerous chances they had to stop the Parkland shooting from happening at all. In fact, Scott Israel was rightly removed as Broward County Sheriff by Ron DeSantis. He's trying to get his old job back – and hopefully, that run fails.

But Second Amendment supporters also know how the FBI fumbled at least one opportunity to stop it. Yet Blumenthal and Wasserman Schultz are instead punishing millions of Americans for this shooting – for a crime they did not commit. This is a clear example of an injustice being inflicted – and for what? It's not about making the country safer.

The fact of the matter is that existing laws provide an opening to deal with prohibited persons who have even one round of ammunition in their possession. Second Amendment supporters need to contact their Senators and Representative and politely urge them to oppose S 1924 and HR 1705.

HR 49 - Prevent Gun Trafficking Act

There is bad legislation intended to harm our rights. That sort of legislation, like, say, banning and buying back modern multi-purpose semi-automatic rifles, is easy to decide to oppose, and easy to call what it is. Other laws can be bad because they address a problem in a manner that infringes on our rights rather than use existing laws on the books. See various gun trafficking laws, like the Prevent Gun Trafficking Act, for cases in point.

Some, though, don't really seem to do anything. One such bill is HR 49, the Accidental Firearms Transfers

Reporting Act, introduced by Representative Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX). Representative Jackson Lee has introduced a number of anti-Second Amendment bills, including a package of three bills in response to the Santa Fe High School shooting (HR 4080, HR 4081, and HR 4082) that targeted our rights.

First of all, the title of the bill is a very clumsy piece of anti-Second Amendment propaganda.

By claiming some transfers are “accidental,” Representative Jackson Lee is trying to make it seem as if these transfers were not intended to happen. That completely misses the point on multiple levels. In a very real sense, no firearms transfer from a federally licensed dealer is accidental.

What the bill requires is no more than a report that lists the number of times when a NICS check goes beyond three business days and the transfer goes ahead. The entire goal is to try and scare Americans into infringing on Second Amendment rights.

As we discussed with the Firearms Due Process Protection Act, when it comes to denying a constitutional right, the government should be bearing the burden of proof. In the case of the National Instant Check System, part of the approach was to say that if a denial did not come within three business days, the transfer could go ahead. Now, this process needs improvements like those in the Firearms Due Process Protection Act.

Representative Jackson Lee has proposed other legislation that does the exact opposite of placing the burden of proof on the government. This is a good reason not to give this bill the benefit of the doubt.

Given that this bill is intended to create “data” for anti-Second Amendment propaganda, Second Amendment supporters need to

contact their Senators and Representative and urge them to oppose HR 49.

HR 2079 - the Freedom Financing Act

We have discussed the threat that corporate gun control poses to our Second Amendment rights multiple times. One of the threats is when companies like Salesforce have attempted to leverage their products to force companies to go along with infringements on our right to keep and bear arms. In many ways, the fight for our Second Amendment rights has now expanded to the boardroom and cubicle.

That said, the biggest threat is the financial blacklist. If banks, credit card companies, and credit unions refuse to do business with Second Amendment supporters or the firearms industry, any legal battle won at the Supreme Court can be rendered meaningless.

The good news is that there is legislation that can shut off the financial blacklist. Representative Roger Williams (R-TX) has introduced HR 2079, the Freedom Financing Act. This legislation pretty much tells major banks, credit unions, and credit card companies that they cannot discriminate on the basis of “reputational risks.”

This is an important phrase. The term “reputational risk” was invoked by Andrew Cuomo when he began abusing financial regulations to silence the National Rifle Association. With the passage of this legislation, Cuomo’s campaign would be rendered toothless. That alone would be an important win and could allow the NRA to sort out its internal issues without existential threat.

But this bill doesn’t stop with securing the NRA. The bill extends security to every pro-Second Amendment group, every firearms manufacturer, and even every feder-

ally licensed dealer. Because the same “reputational risk” nonsense could be aimed at a company making modern multi-purpose semiautomatic firearms or a local gun store.

If enacted into law, HR 2079 ends the potential for “reputational risk” to be used against our Second Amendment rights. But this legislation also goes further, includes language that explicitly prohibits banks, credit unions, and credit card companies from discriminating against FFLs, be they manufacturers, importers, or dealers. The bill also backs it up with civil penalties of up to \$10,000. But the real teeth in the bill is the prohibition of using the Automated Clearing House Network for banks that discriminate against FFLs.

To put it mildly, this is a bill that will make a huge difference in preventing the use of financial blacklisting to attack our rights. It goes without saying that Second Amendment supporters should contact their Representative and Senators and politely urge them to support HR 2079.

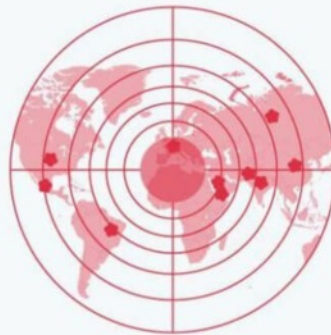
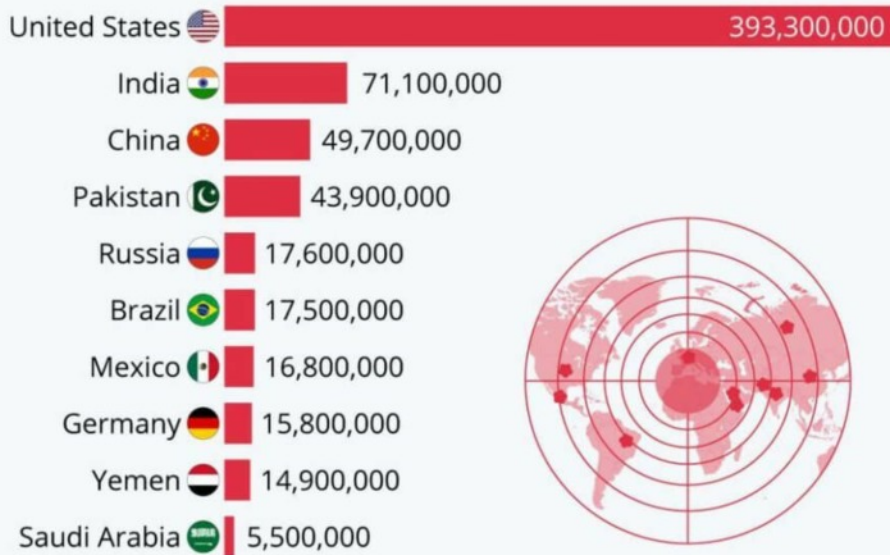

Who's Who in Firearms - Part 7

Small Arms Lexicon and Encyclopedias, Chester Mueller and John Olson, Shooter's Bible, South Hackensack, New Jersey, 1st Ed., 1968

Mannlicher, Ferdinand Ritter von (1848-1903) - Austrian engineer and inventor born in Germany whose name was given to a rifle stock extending from the butt to the muzzle, although it wasn't his development.

Manton, Joseph (1766-1835) - An English gunsmith and inventor who, with his brother John, were famous London gunsmiths. He patented a percussion pellet lock (1816) and a tube lock (1818). His elevated rib for sighting double-barrel firearms and a patented breech are his most popular inventions.

Marlin, John Mahlon (1836-1901) - American inventor and firearms manufacturer who founded the original Marlin Firearms Co.

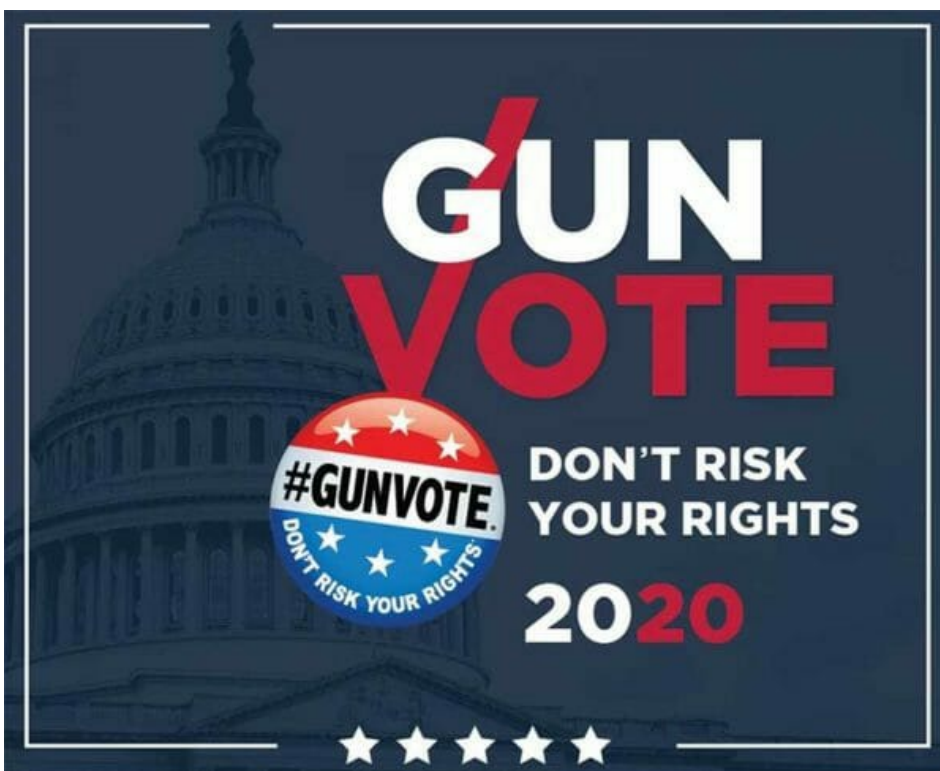
Martini, Frederick von - Swiss gunsmith who developed a special firing lock inside the breechblock. It used a Henry rifled barrel, thus becoming the Martini-Henry rifle adopted by the British in 1871.

Mauser, Peter Paul (1834-1914) - German gunsmith and inventor of the first successful metallic cartridge bolt action rifle. The patent was taken out first in the U.S. In 1868. His name associated with rifles, pistols, and revolvers.

Mauser, Wilhelm - Brother of Peter, above, and co-inventor of the bolt action known as Mauser.

Maxim, Hiram Stevens (1840-1916) - Known as the father of modern semi-automatic firearms. Maxim machine guns were developed in 1884 and first used by British forces in 1891, and in combat in Africa in 1893-94. They quickly replaced the Gatling gun.

Maxim, Hiram Percy (1869-1936) - Son of Hiram S., Developed the Maxim silencer used until 1925.



Handgun Training: Seven Critical Aspects of Pistol Shooting

Whether you're training for self-defense, competing at a match, on the silhouette range, or plinking with a .22 pistol, seven fundamentals of handgun training apply.

Trigger finger placement is very important no matter what shooting discipline you are engaged in. This finger position will likely cause the pressure on the trigger to be applied to the left side, and not straight to the rear as it should be.

Seven fundamentals of basic pistol marksmanship

Stance - The stance as it applies to the handgun is nothing more than

the position of feet and body relative to the target. It sounds simple, but it's actually one of the most critical and also one of the most often overlooked aspects of pistol shooting.

Position - This is nothing more than taking the stance and make sure that we are positioned naturally toward the target, or, put another way, we are trying to find our natural point of aim.

Grip - Simply pick the pistol up, and you are gripping it, right? Not so fast. There are several do's and don'ts when establishing the proper firing grip. Two of the main aspects of establishing a proper grip are

consistency and tension. Read more.

Sight alignment - In order to shoot a handgun with any accuracy, the pistol's sights need to be in alignment. Sight alignment is nothing more than the front sight post centered within the rear sight notch, with equal daylight on both sides of the front sight post, and the top of the front sight level with the top of the rear sight.

Trigger control - The smooth release of the trigger mechanism of any firearm is a critical factor is the delivery of an accurate shot. On the face of it, it's a very simple act but within that simple act is a complex series of events that have to take place.

Breathing - Good breathing techniques are extremely important in all types of shooting, from the slow fire match in bullseye, to speed shooting steel targets, which typically is over in less than two or three seconds.

Mental discipline - Shooting is both a physical and a mental game. The ratio of physical versus mental depends on the level of expertise of the individual shooter.

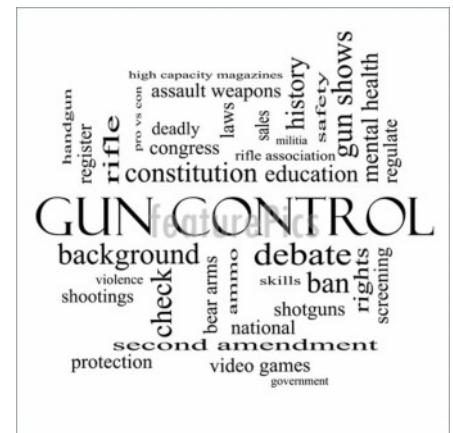

Think Your Guns are Off the Grid? Six Ways They are Tracking You

(AmmoLand.com)- I have had conversations with gun owners from time to time who don't want to get involved in the gun rights movement. Two reasons stand out from my interaction with them. One is lethargy, often associated with the notion that "they are not after my kind of gun." The other is a fear of being a target of radical gun prohibitionists enforcing some sort of gun ban. I will address each of these here, pointing out possible flaws with each position.

My Gun Is Safe

Adherents to this notion have believed that the gun grabbers were not interested in their particular type of firearms hardware. Gun owners have historically been divided into several groups, with often overlapping edges. You have hunters, target shooters, plinkers, and defensive carriers, each group with their own interests. Hunters may only fire a handful of shots each year, a few sighting-in shots at the beginning of the season, and then what's necessary to take their chosen game. This group has been derogatorily labeled by some as Fudd's after Elmer Fudd, of Looney Toons fame.

Well, now, we've all heard that Elmer has had his gun banned. Instead, he is left with the Grim Reaper's scythe. So maybe your double-barrel is not safe, nor that old bolt action. After all, bolt action rifles are the "sniper's weapon of choice".

They are not after your hunting gun now, but maybe later. These Goldilocks gun grabbers can never find a gun that is just right (for you to keep).

Out Of Sight, Out Of Mind

Others adhere to the notion that if they keep a low profile, they are safe from the gun grabbers. Let's explore this low profile idea.

In many jurisdictions, private sales are perfectly legal. Some gun owners are very careful to only purchase their firearms this way, in an attempt to stay away from the purview of officialdom. Maybe that'll work, maybe not?

Your papers, please.

So you don't want to register your guns; and although NICS records are purported to be destroyed after the transaction, who knows for sure? If you have bought them all in private sales, you may be safe to a point. But are you a registered gun owner? Have you unwittingly gotten on a list?

Here are six (6) actions that will (or may) put you on one.

- Do you have a state-issued handgun permit? You're on a list.
- Do you get any firearms-related publications? Informed Delivery may not be your friend.
- Do you order any parts or accessories online? There's a record.

- Do you use a debit or credit card to buy ammo? Hmm... we have seen how pro-gun banks can be.
- Do your FedEx or UPS ammo deliveries have HAZMAT labels? Everybody knows what's under the plain brown wrapper.
- Do you shop locally and pay with cash, but your dealer has video surveillance?

How difficult would it be for a rogue gun-grabbing government agency to build a dossier on you?

So, unless you live further off the grid than Randy Weaver did, staying on the down-low just may not work.

Get Up, Get Going

The thing to do is fight for your rights while you can. If the situation deteriorates to the level that Alfred Flatow experienced, it will be too late.

Now is the time to welcome new shooters to the fold, get after your elected representatives, and be proactive in advancing the Second Amendment. As Ole Ben Franklin is quoted as saying, "**WE MUST HANG TOGETHER OR SURELY WE SHALL HANG SEPARATELY.**"
