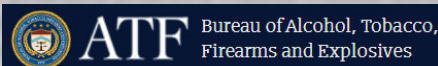

Through executive orders and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (BATFE) rule making, the current administration continues its attacks on the Second Amendment. The Vice President recently renewed the call for a ban on semi-automatic firearms, which are commonly possessed and used for many legal purposes.

The administration is also trying to expand the definition of "gun dealer" to mean anyone who sells a gun "predominately" to make a profit. Do you know anyone who sells anything intending to lose money? There is chatter on the Left to limit non-regulated gun sellers to as few as five individual gun sales per year. See the following links on the newly announced BATFE rule, which has provisions that affect gun show sales and other transactions. Warning: please be aware that the links may contain implied or openly expressed Main Stream Media bias. We will provide information on submitting comments on the rule in a future alert.

The BATFE is shutting down an increasing number of gun dealers for clerical errors that previously would have resulted in correction notices from the agency. A reliable source within the local gun industry reports that many Colorado firearms dealers are ending gun sales, because of potential lawsuits enabled by Colorado State Senate Bill 23-168. This bill makes it easier to sue anyone in the firearms industry who was in any way involved in the manufacture, transportation, marketing, or sale of a gun that was subsequently used in a crime by third party. The process becomes the punishment for small businesses that cannot afford the cost of a lawsuit, even if they are ultimately found blameless.

We have seen what happens when the Left has control of the levers of government power at any level. Only the courts now stand between the Second Amendment and those who would destroy it; and the courts are under attack by the Left.

We believe the obvious way to correct this situation practically, legally, and peacefully is a groundswell of political activism from Second Amendment supporters that sweeps the anti-gun elements from power in a fully transparent, honest, and fair election. Please support election integrity efforts, such as True the Vote. Support pro-individual rights candidates from the most pro-Second Amendment major political party. A third-party vote or a protest vote is a wasted vote. Mike Rosen is right. "Party trumps person!" The party in power at any level controls the political/legislative process and the agenda.

The next election cycle is underway. If pro-Second Amendment supporters do not gain in this upcoming round, there may not be a way to use the political process to restore sanity and justice to our state and country. With every victory the Left further consolidates power.

Copyright Disclaimer under section 107 of the Copyright Act 1976, allowance is made for "fair use" for purposes such as criticism, comment, news reporting, teaching, scholarship, education and research.

Fair use is a use permitted by copyright statute that might otherwise be infringing.

Non-profit, educational or personal use tips the balance in favor of fair use.

FAIR USE DEFINITION:

Fair use is a doctrine in the United States copyright law that allows limited use of copyrighted material without requiring permission from the rights holders, such as for commentary, criticism, news reporting, research, teaching or scholarship. It provides for the legal, non-licensed citation or incorporation of copyrighted material in another author's work under a four-factor balancing test. The term "fair use" originated in the United States. A similar principle, fair dealing, exists in some other common law jurisdictions. Civil law jurisdictions have other limitations and exceptions to copyright.

U.S. COPYRIGHT OFFICE - FAIR USE DEFINITION:

One of the rights accorded to the owner of copyright is the right to reproduce or to authorize others to reproduce the work in copies or phonorecords. This right is subject to certain limitations found in sections 107 through 118 of the copyright law (title 17, U.S. Code). One of the more important limitations is the doctrine of "fair use". The doctrine of fair use has developed through a substantial number of court decisions over the years and has been codified in section 107 of the copyright law.

Section 107 contains a list of the various purposes for which the reproduction of a particular work may be considered fair, such as criticism, comment, news reporting, teaching, scholarship, and research. Section 107 also sets out in four factors to be considered in determining whether or not a particular use is fair:

1. The purpose and character of the use, including whether such use is of commercial nature or is for nonprofit educational purposes
2. The nature of the copyrighted work
3. The amount and substantiality of the portion used in relation to the copyrighted work as a whole
4. The effect of the use upon the potential market for, or value of, the copyrighted work

The distinction between fair use and infringement may be unclear and not easily defined. There is no specific number of words, lines, or notes that may safely be taken without permission. Acknowledging the source of the copyrighted material does not substitute for obtaining permission.

The 1961 Report of the Register of Copyrights on the General Revision of the U.S. Copyright Law cites examples of activities that courts have regarded as fair use: "quotation of excerpts in a review or criticism for purposes of illustration or comment; quotation of short passages in a scholarly or technical work, for illustration or clarification of the author's observations; use in a parody of some of the content of the work parodied; summary of an address or article, with brief quotations, in a news report; reproduction by a library of a portion of a work to replace part of a damaged copy; reproduction by a teacher or student of a small part of a work to illustrate a lesson; reproduction of a work in legislative or judicial proceedings or reports; incidental and fortuitous reproduction, in a newsreel or broadcast, of a work located in the scene of an event being reported."

Copyright protects the particular way an author has expressed himself. It does not extend to any ideas, systems, or factual information conveyed in the work. The safest course is always to get permission from the copyright owner before using copyrighted material.
